WHAT TO EXPECT WHEN YOU REFER

No two client journeys are the same, but here are some of the things you can expect when making a referral to us:

Referral made

Allocation to Employment Officer (EO)

EO makes initial contact

At initial 1 to 1 meeting, initial assessments, vocational profiles and action plans are used to create a tailored package of employment support for the client

This can include:

- Job Searching
- CV Writing
- Application Forms
- Interview Preparation Support

Followed by:

- Training
- Volunteering
- Employer Engagement and Job Carving
- Travel Training
 - 1 to 1 support in the workplace

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MONTHLY CASE STUDY - LAWRANCE

Lawrance joined the project in November 2021 after being out of work for the best part of a decade, and during this time he had been coming to terms with his autism diagnosis. Under Solent Get Into Employment he has:

- Learned interview techniques
- Refined his CV
- Improved time keeping
- Gained work experience with a retailer and started agency work at the docks
- Explored apprenticeship opportunities
- Completed GCSE English, Warehousing course and forklift training

- Received financial support to get a motorbike licence to be able to travel to more remote work locations
- Received financial help to get smart clothes for interview

Lawrance in his own words:

"After struggling for years trying to find work and unsure how to even talk to an employer about my mental heath issues, finding a job was a nightmare. I started to believe that I would never be able to work. But working with Paul helped make things so much easier. Knowing I had support and someone who could help me contact employers has actually helped me back into work. I couldn't have done it without my Employment Officer's help. Thank you so much."
